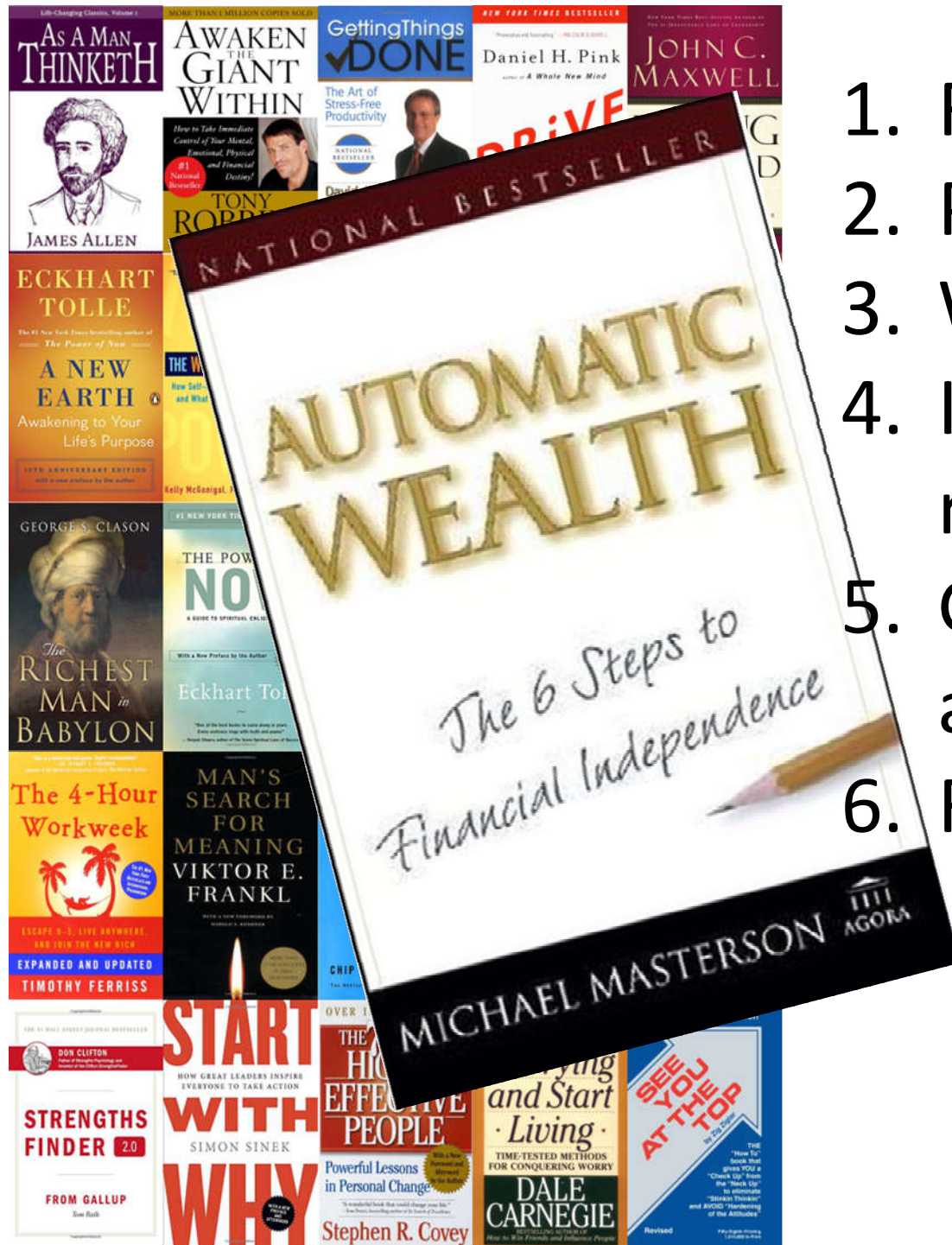

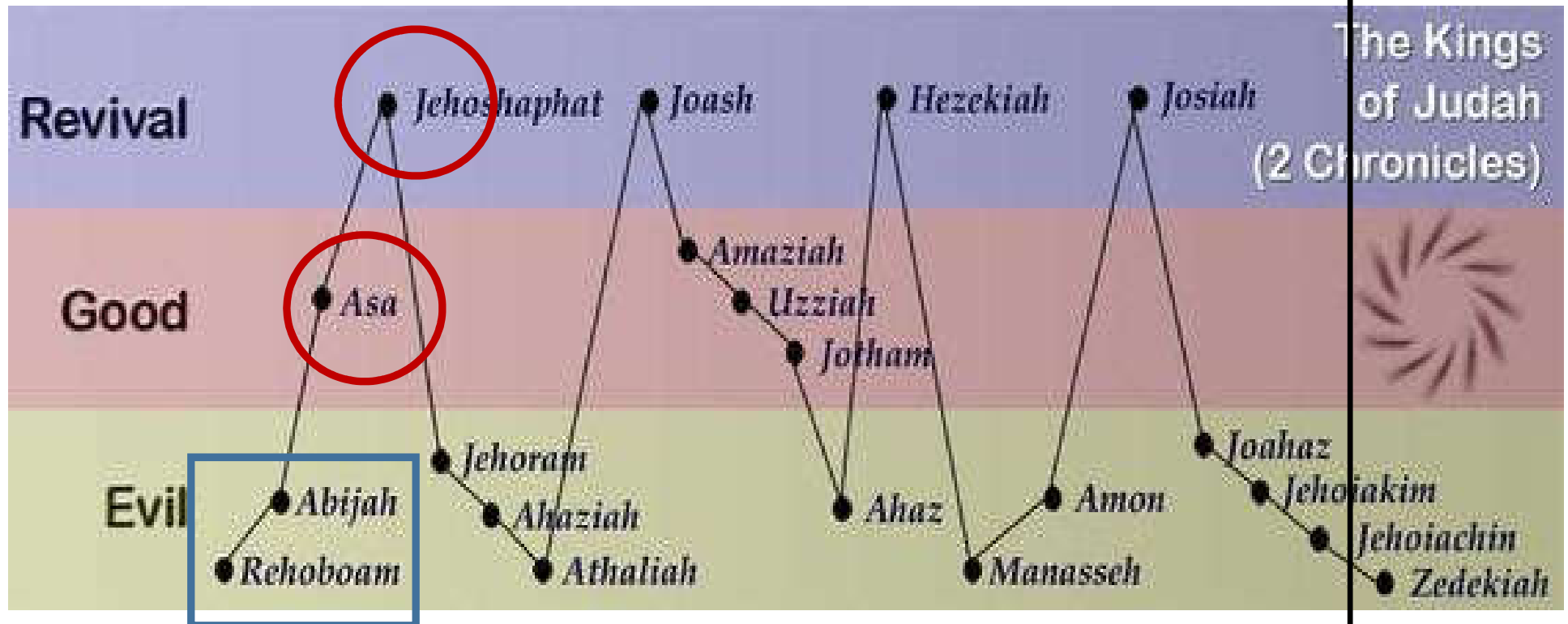

Was King Abijah a good or evil king? The 2 Chron 13 account sees him fighting against King Jeroboam and declaring God has anointed Judah as the chosen lineage of David. And even though they were outnumbered 2x (400k vs 800k men) and Jeroboam had a sneak attack yet God aided Abijah. Yet in 1 Kings 15 it is said that he committed all the sins his father had done before him; his heart was not fully devoted to the LORD his God.



What King Rehoboam (his grandfather did)

- abandoned the law of the Lord
- unfaithful to the Lord
- He did evil because he had not set his heart on seeking the Lord.

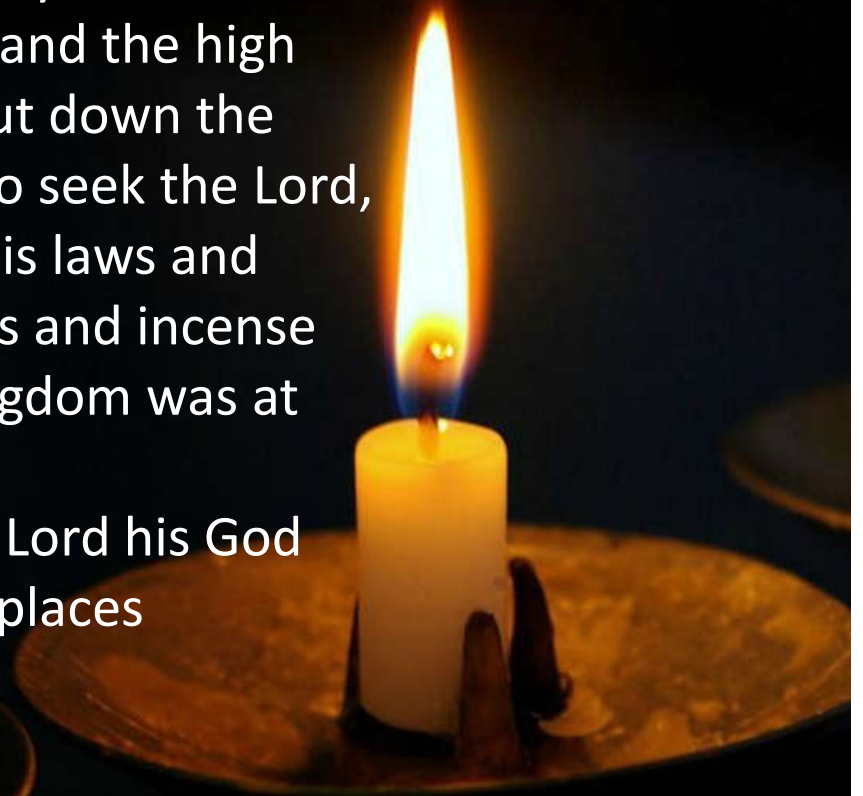
King Asa's light could be seen (it was "different")

(2 Chronicles 14:2-3)

2 Asa did what was good and right in the eyes of the Lord his God. 3 He removed the foreign altars and the high places, smashed the sacred stones and cut down the Asherah poles. 4 He commanded Judah to seek the Lord, the God of their ancestors, and to obey his laws and commands. 5 He removed the high places and incense altars in every town in Judah, and the kingdom was at peace under him.

What is good and right in the eyes of the Lord his God

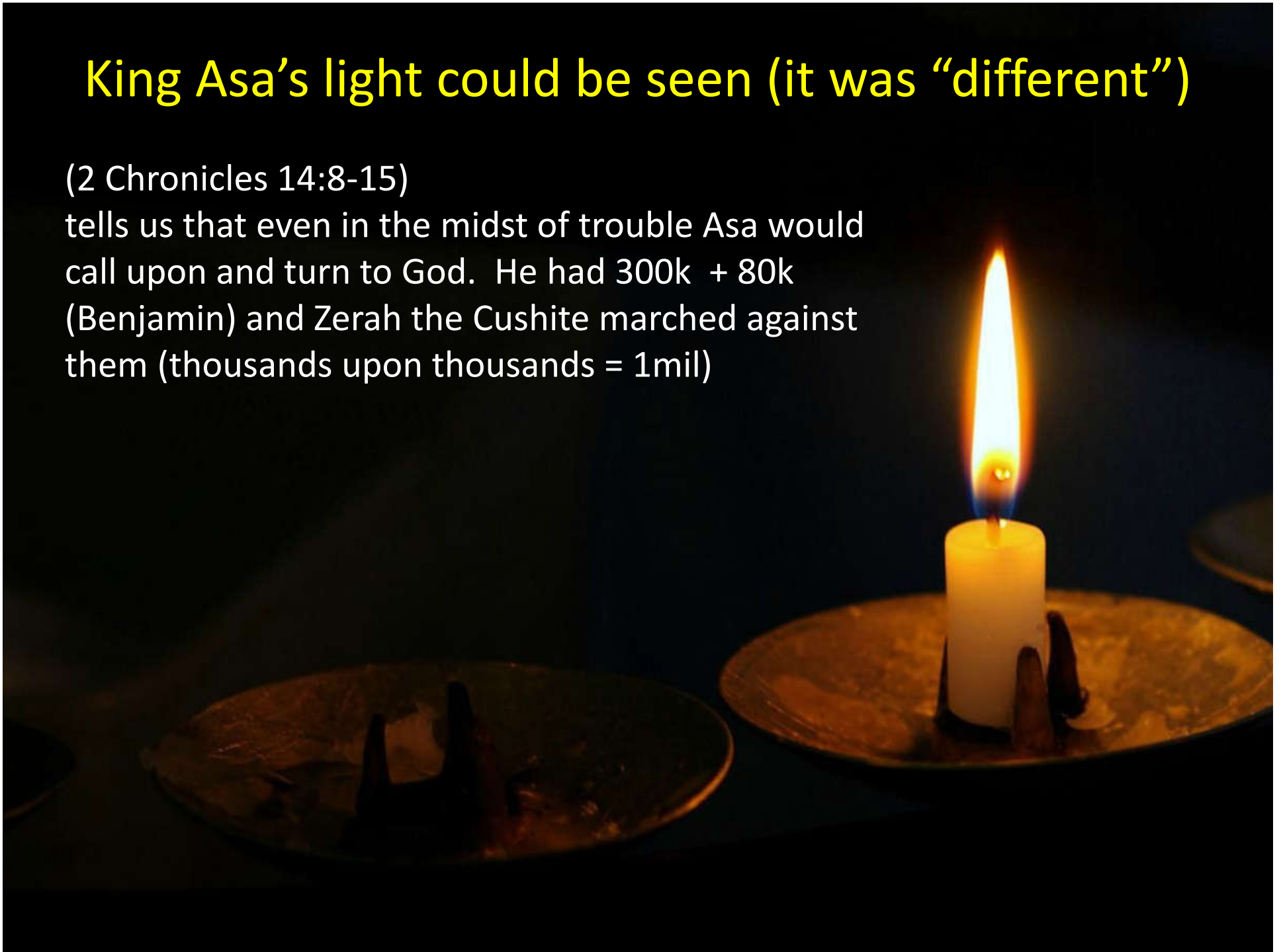
1. Removed the foreign altars and high places
2. Smashed the sacred stones
3. Cut down the Asherah poles
4. Commanded Judah to seek the Lord and obey his laws and commands

King Asa's light could be seen (it was "different")

(2 Chronicles 14:8-15)

tells us that even in the midst of trouble Asa would call upon and turn to God. He had 300k + 80k (Benjamin) and Zerah the Cushite marched against them (thousands upon thousands = 1mil)



King Asa's light could be seen (it was "different")

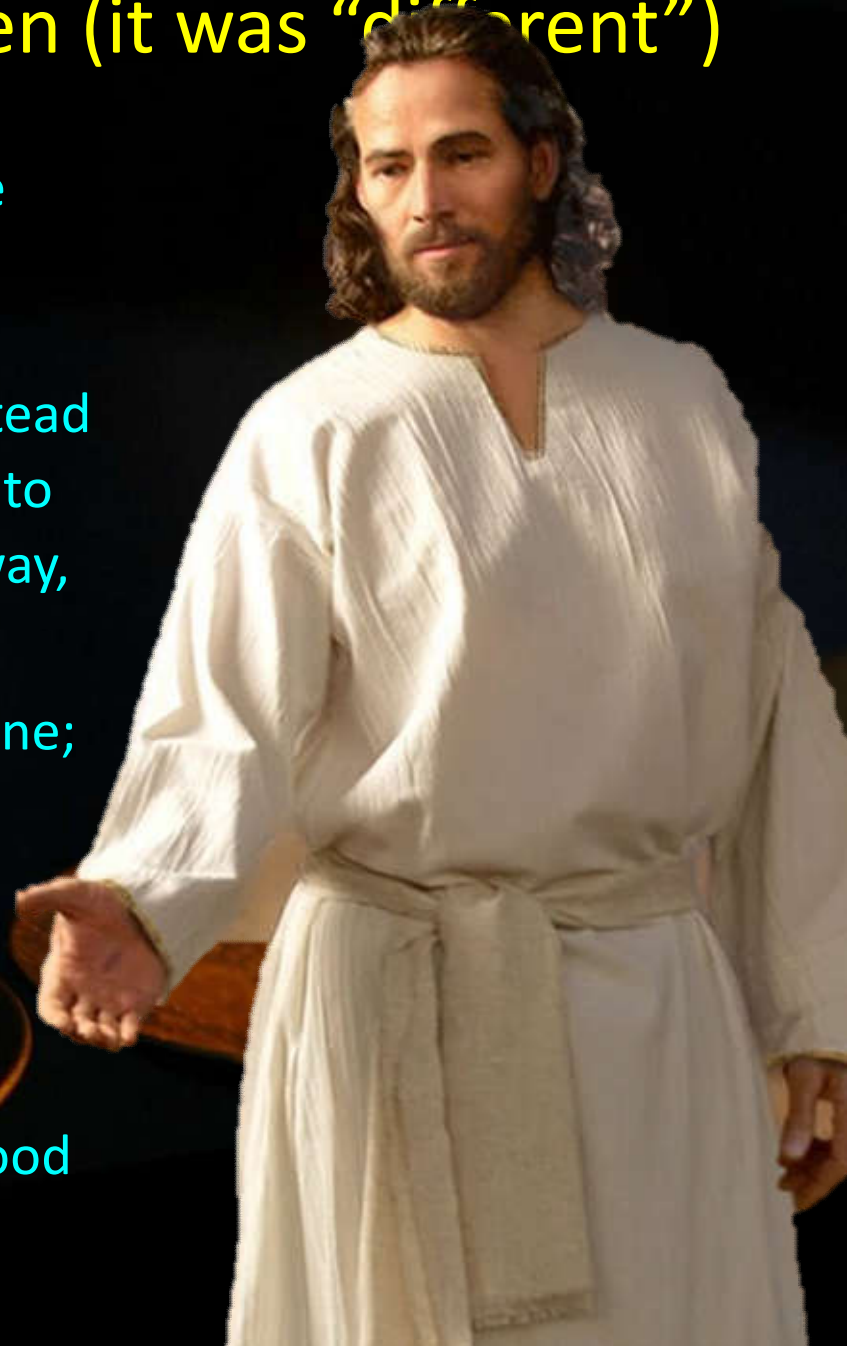
Jesus says in Matthew 5: 14 "You are the light of the world. A town built on a hill cannot be hidden. 15 Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. 16 In the same way, let your light

shine ...

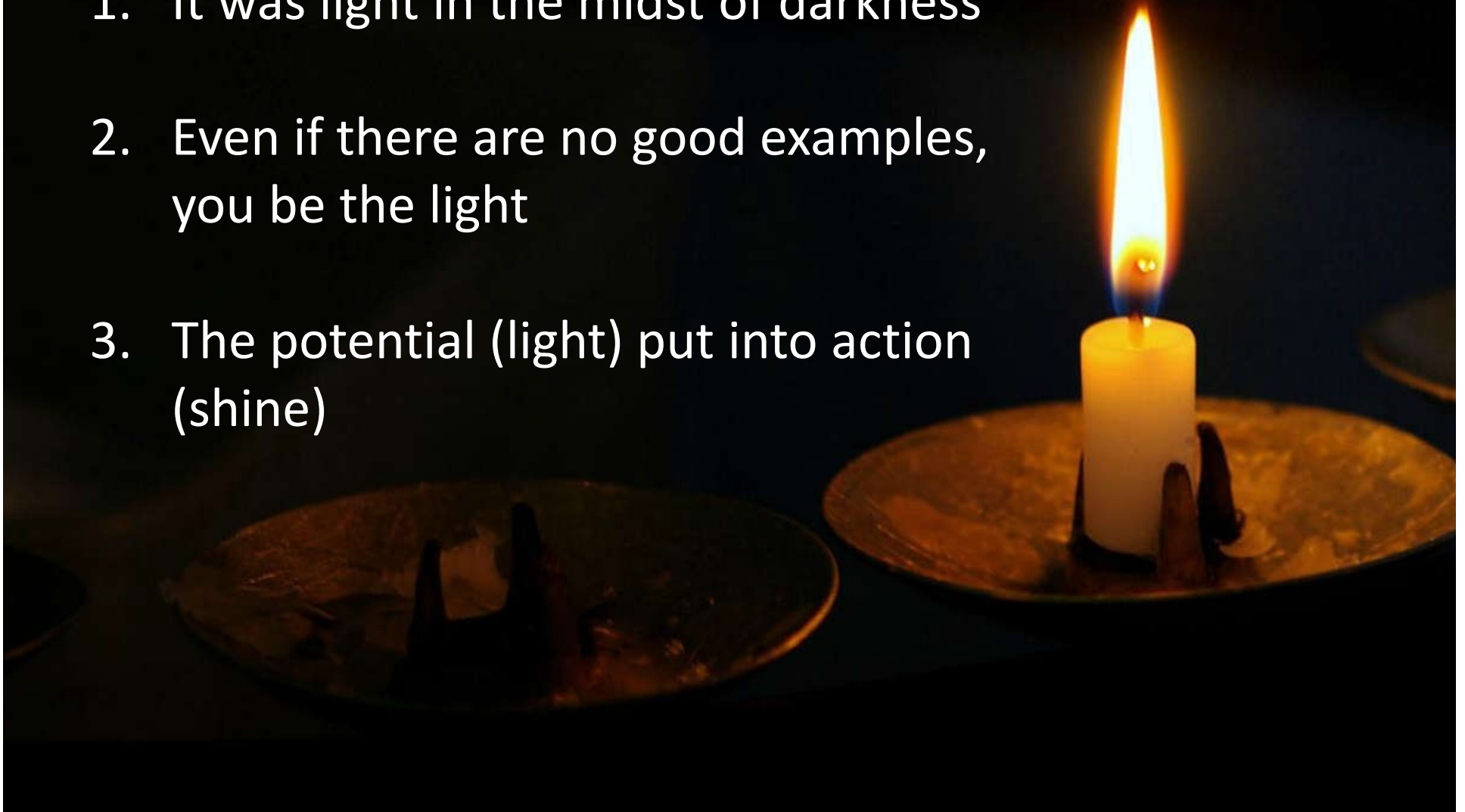
[G2989 lampo (as in lamp) – to beam; to radiate]

before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven.

In 2 Chronicles 15,

“The Spirit of God came on Azariah son of Oded. 2 He went out to meet Asa and said to him, “Listen to me, Asa and all Judah and Benjamin. The Lord is with you when you are with him. If you seek him, he will be found by you, but if you forsake him, he will forsake you. 3 For a long time Israel was without the true God, without a priest to teach and without the law. 4 But in their distress they turned to the Lord, the God of Israel, and sought him, and he was found by them. 5 In those days it was not safe to travel about, for all the inhabitants of the lands were in great turmoil. 6 One nation was being crushed by another and one city by another, because God was troubling them with every kind of distress. 7 But as for you, be strong and do not give up, for your work will be rewarded.”

How do we respond to God’s Word?

How do we respond to God's Word? The right way is to respond with zeal.

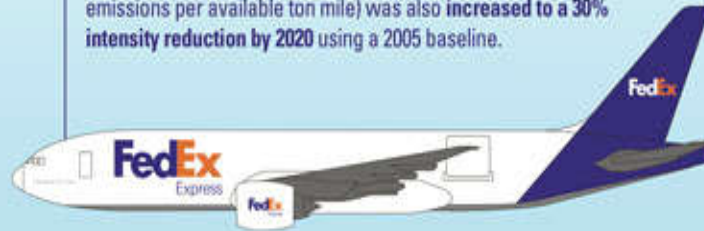
1. He removed the detestable idols from the whole land of Judah and Benjamin and from the towns he had captured in the hills of Ephraim. He repaired the altar of the Lord that was in front of the portico of the Lord's temple.
2. He assembled all Judah and Benjamin and the people from Ephraim, Manasseh and Simeon who had settled among them. they sacrificed to the Lord seven hundred head of cattle and seven thousand sheep and goats from the plunder they had brought back. 12 They entered into a covenant to seek the Lord, the God of their ancestors, with all their heart and soul.
3. King Asa also deposed his grandmother Maakah from her position as queen mother, because she had made a repulsive image for the worship of Asherah.
4. V17. Asa's heart was fully committed to the Lord all his life.



A SUSTAINABLE FUTURE

Through energy efficiency and diversification, collaborations and advocacy, FedEx is helping to create a more sustainable world and business for the future.


7 Qualities of a God-fearing man King Asa

- Baasha king of Israel went up against Judah and fortified Ramah (v.1)
- Asa then took the silver and gold out of the treasuries of the Lord's temple and of his own palace and sent it to Ben-Hadad king of Aram (v.2-6)
- Hanani the seer rebuked king Asa for forgetting the Lord and not relying on it and proclaimed a judgement (v.7-9)
- King Asa went angry. He was later inflicted with disease in his feet - but did not seek help from God until his death. (v.10-14)

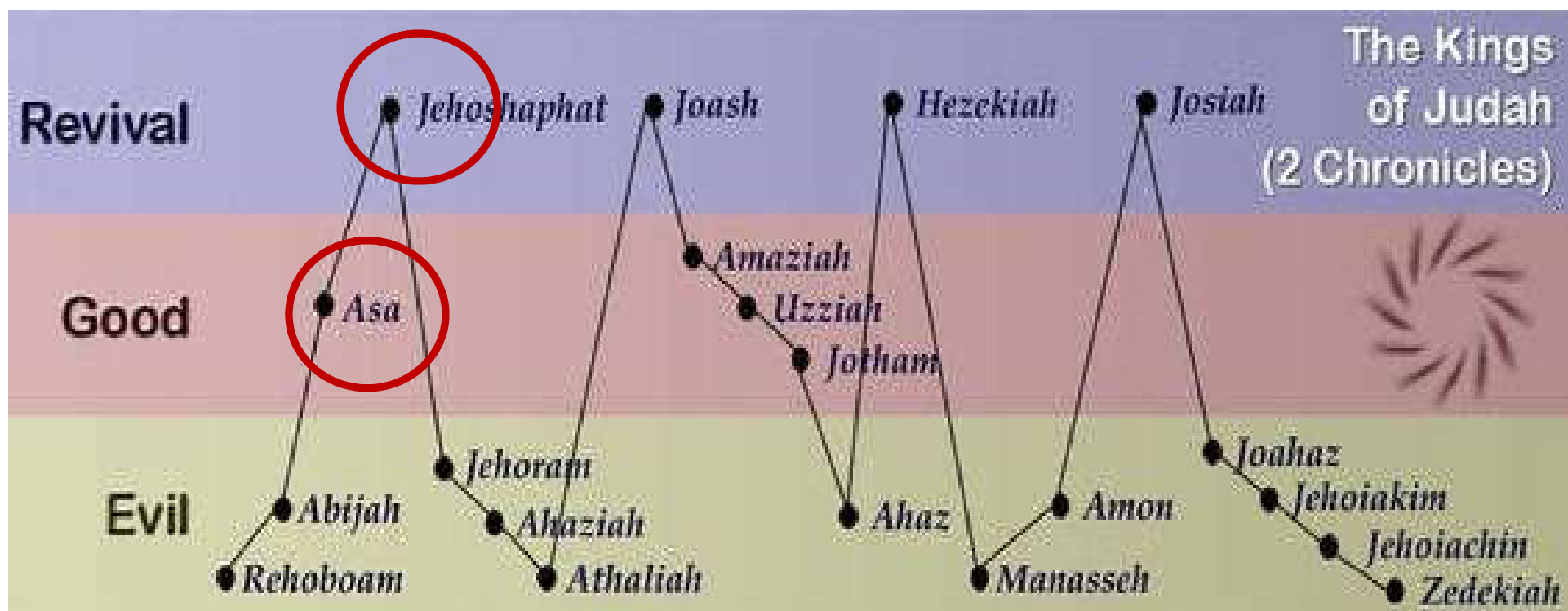

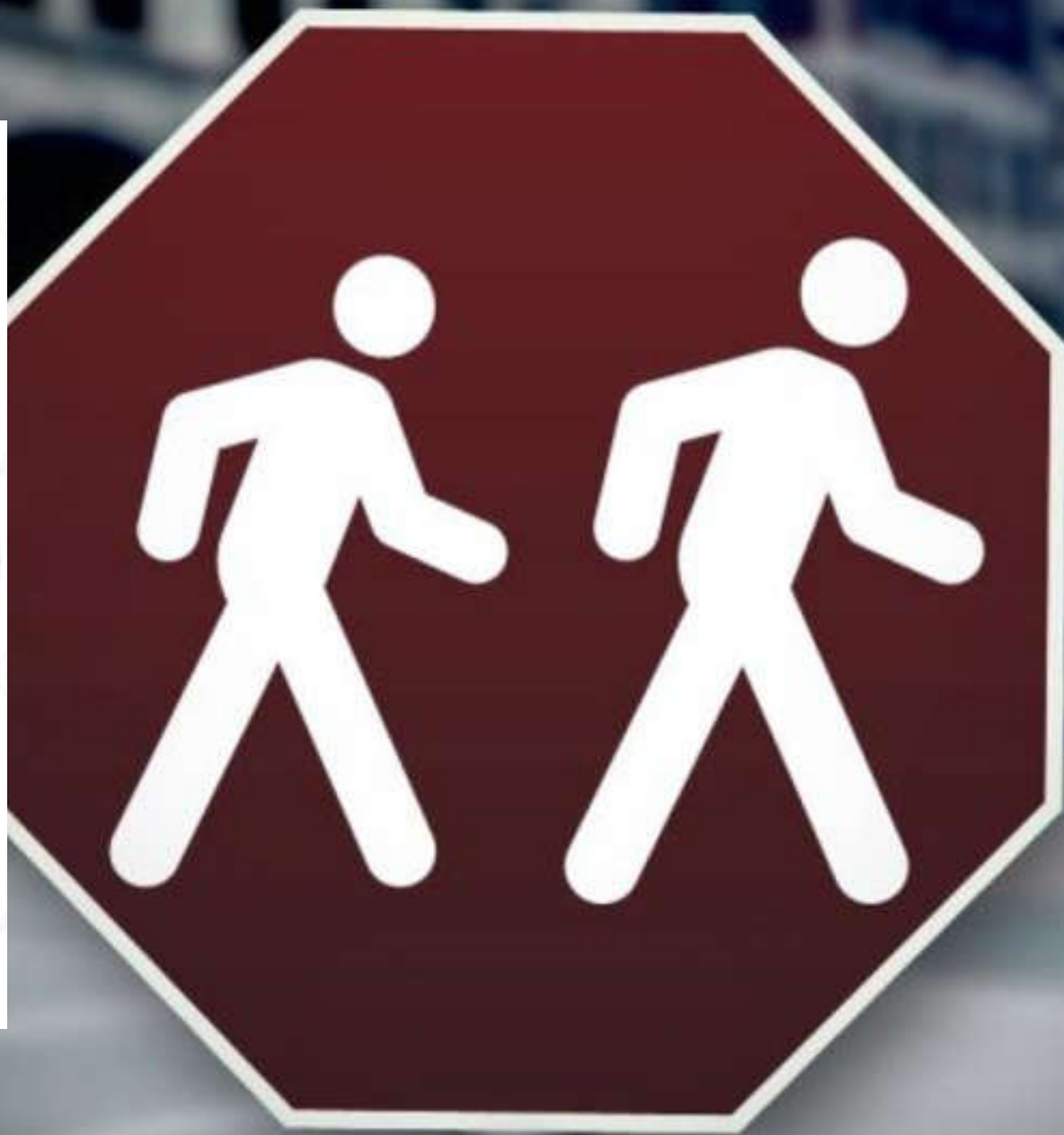

A heart devoted to the ways of God (17:6)

H1361 (ga-bahh) – to lift up, exalt, be high, raise up ... the ways of the Lord

1. He followed [walked; manner of life; come; depart; proceed] the ways [H7223 ri-shon + (first/primary/former) H1870 de-rek (road; journey; manner)] of his father David. The best of David.
2. Sought the God of his fathers and followed his commands rather than the practices of Israel (v. 3) cf Romans 12:1-2
3. He was a teaching King. V.7-9. It was not enough for him to follow God, but he wanted everyone under his influence to follow God's ways. All towns. Imagine our families, our youths.

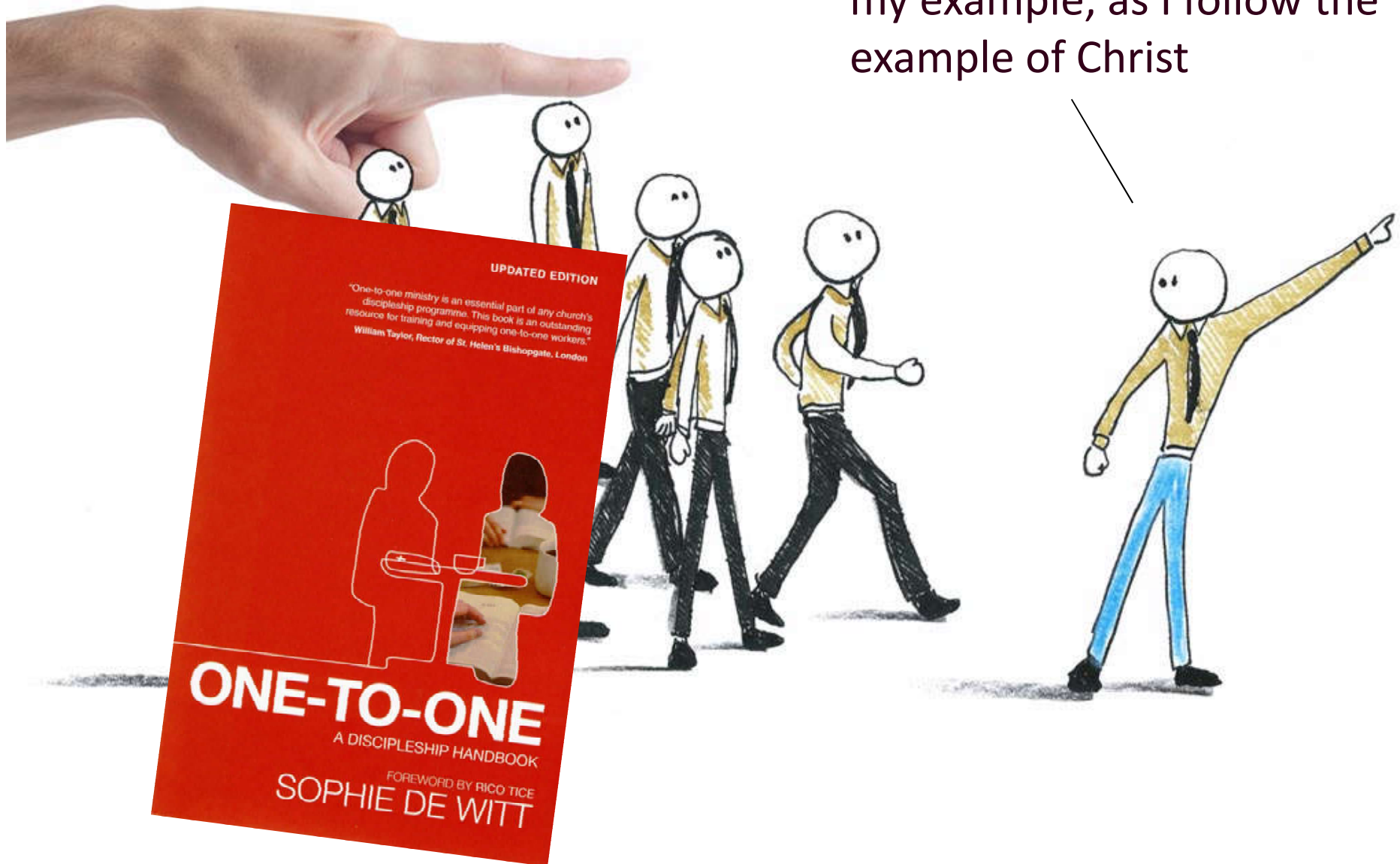

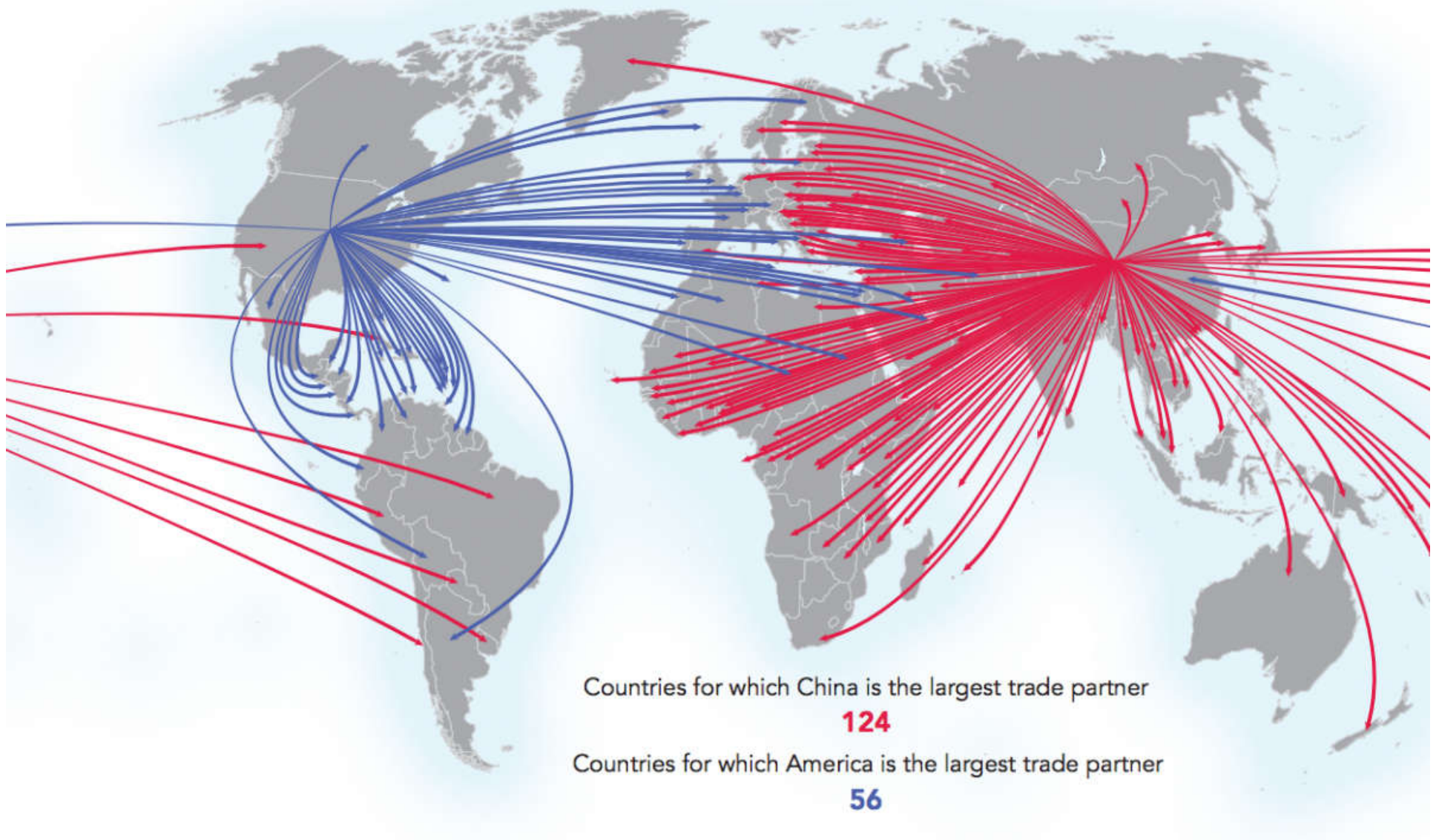

A **sphere of influence** (SOI) is a division over which a state or organization has a level of cultural, economic, military, or political ... powers outside the borders of the state that controls it.

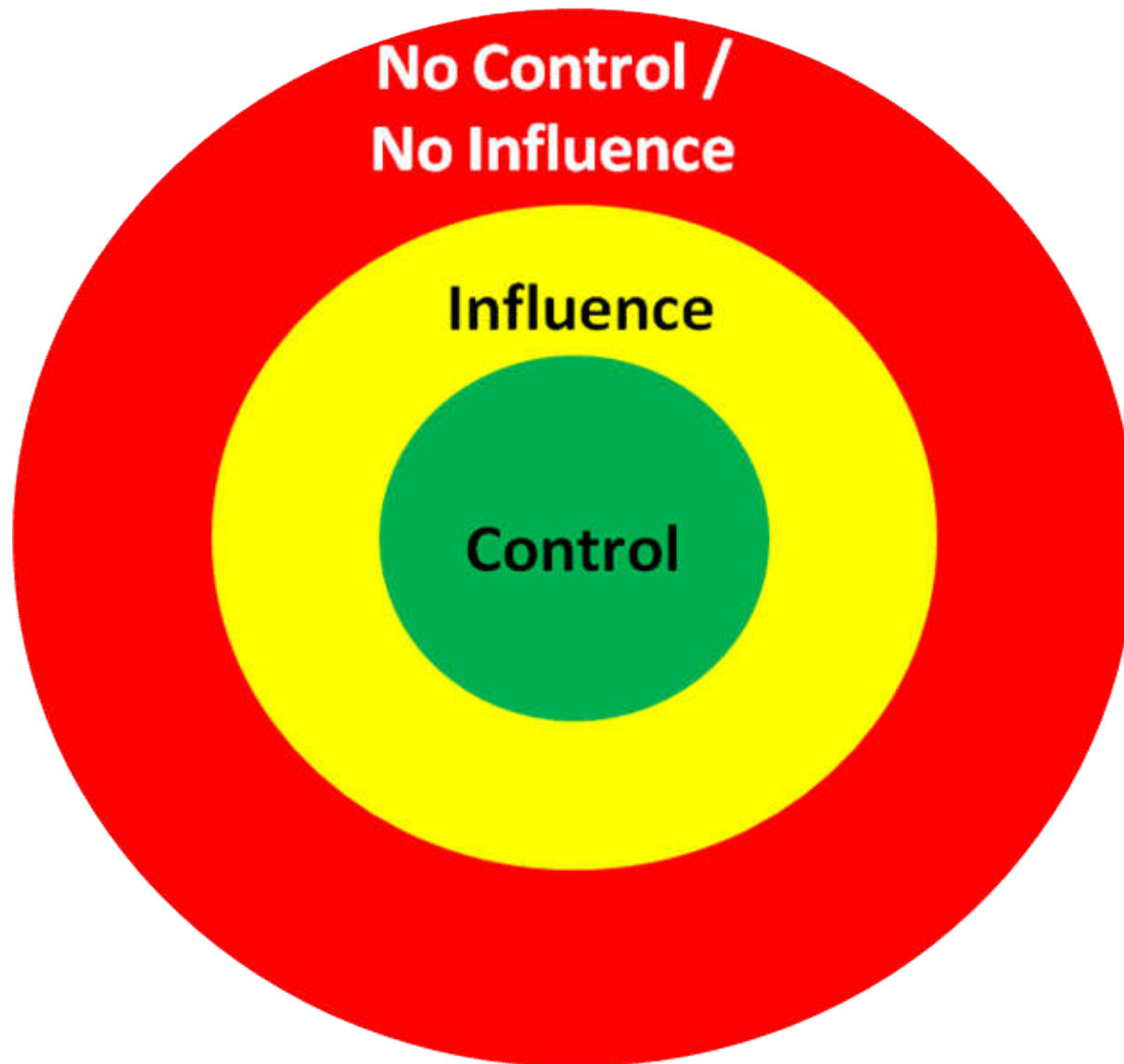

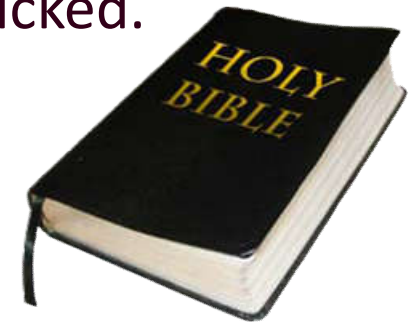

You Have 15 Minutes To Respond To A Crisis:

A Checklist of Do's and Don't's



DO

- ☐ Become the trusted voice in the crisis.
- ☐ Give the crisis your full attention.
- ☐ Pull the trigger on your crisis plan.
- ☐ Assess what you can do yourself and what you can delegate.
- ☐ Find out the facts and connect with authorities.
- ☐ Monitor social and traditional media closely.
- ☐ Understand the scope of the issue and assess the critical decisions.
- ☐ Issue a "holding statement" ASAP.
- ☐ Think through every word.
- ☐ Put people first.
- ☐ Correct any errors of fact that are already public.
- ☐ Contact your key audiences (employees, board, shareholders).



DON'T

- ☐ Lie.
- ☐ Disappear.
- ☐ Issue a denial until you have all the facts.
- ☐ Minimize the situation.
- ☐ Make a joke about the crisis.
- ☐ Say "we are taking the matter seriously."
- ☐ Repeat the problem or accusation in your statement.
- ☐ Let your fears of liability trump your humanity.
- ☐ Speculate until you understand the facts.
- ☐ Be only inwardly-focused.
