







(Jam 2:17) ... FAITH by itself, if it is not accompanied by action, is dead.




(Jam 2:17) ... faith by itself, if it is not accompanied by ACTION, is dead.





- (KJV) "Even so faith, if it hath not works, is dead, being alone."
- G3498 (Strong's a corpse, dead Matt 8:22) (Thayer's <u>lifeless</u> as in breath his last; spiritually dead Roman 6:13)
- Israel had the Law of God ... but were dead. (OT)

Why Stand Ye Here Idle?

"...Why stand ye here all the day idle?" —Matthew 20:6

In Matthew 20:6 Jesus tells a parable, likening the kingdom of Heaven to a man who hired servants to labor. There was much work to be done and time was running out. The householder saw a group of people standing idle and asked them, "Why stand ye here idle?"

The Lord asks this question today to every believer who is sitting-on-the-premises, instead of standing-on-the-promises! Soul-winning is not a quaint suggestion, nor a commission for the clergy; it is a Biblical commands, a royal decree from our great King, Jesus Christ.

I've known believers who possessed a wealth of Scriptural knowledge, but never lifted a finger to win anyone to Christ. That is NOT Biblical Christianity. God isn't interested in deeper-lifer believers who never do more for Christ than fill 18" of pew every Sunday. I speak to saved Christians. Why stand ye here idle?

Matt 8:28-34 Jesus restores two demon possessed men - "What do you want with us, Son of God?" they shouted. "Have you come here to torture us before the appointed time?"... demons begged Jesus, "If you drive us out, send us into the herd of pigs."

In Jewish tradition, Abraham is called **Avraham Avinu**, (אבינו) "our father Abraham," signifying that he is both the biological progenitor of the Jews (including converts, according to Jewish tradition), and the father of Judaism, the first Jew.


The other extreme. A women. A Gentile. A sinner.

The second error is "easy believism," the teaching that, as long as a person prayed a prayer or said, "I believe in Jesus," at some point in his life, then he is saved, no matter what. So a person who, as a child, raised his hand in a church service is considered saved, even though he doesn't show any desire to walk with God since and may be living in blatant sin. This teaching, sometimes called "decisional regeneration".

Matt 7:17-22



Faith without works is dead because it reveals a heart that has not been transformed by God.

When we have been regenerated by the Holy Spirit, our lives will demonstrate that new life.

Practical Tips "Your Hand Matters" in church (even though it's more than a Sunday thing)





- New comers and visitors "no one" befriends them
- 2. Workers are needed "no one" volunteers
- Evangelistic meetings "no one" invites (or prays and tries to invite) or offers to be counsellors
- 4. People (Christians) are broken, discouraged, needing help or mentoring "no one" encourages, helps, prays, visits, gives, arranges

- 1. Be devoted to one another (Rom. 12:10).
- Give preference to one another (Rom. 12:10).
- 3. Be of the same mind toward one another (Rom. 12:16).
- 4. Accept one another by withholding judgment (Rom. 14:1).
- 5. Accept one another by showing deference (Rom. 14:1–5; 15:7).

- 9. Serve one another by showing deference in matters of liberty (Gal. 5:13).
- 10. Bear one another's sin burdens (Gal. 6:2).
- 11. Be gentle with one another (Eph. 4:2).
- 12. Be kind to one another so as to preserve unity (Eph. 4:32).
- 13. Speak truth to one another (Eph. 4:25; Col 3:9).

- 14. Submit to one another (Eph. 5:21).
- 15. Show compassion to one another (Col. 3:12).
- 16. Bear with the inherent sinfulness of one another (Col. 3:13).
- 17. Forgive one another (Col. 3:13).
- 18. Use Spirit-filled, Word-saturated music to teach and admonish one another (Col. 3:16; Eph. 5:19).
- 19. Comfort one another with the hope of Christ's return (1 Thes. 4:18).
- 20. Encourage one another (1 Thes. 5:11).
- 21. Live in peace with one another (1 Thes. 5:13).

- 23. Encourage one another to forsake unbelief and hardness of heart (Heb. 3:13).
