


B) Wise Words of Explanation

1. That we might be prepared to comfort others.







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² Cor 1:5</sup> For just as we share abundantly in the sufferings of Christ, so also our comfort abounds through Christ.

² Cor 1:6</sup> If we are distressed, it is for your comfort and salvation; if we are comforted, it is for your comfort, which produces in you patient endurance of the same sufferings we suffer. ⁷ And our hope for you is firm, because we know that just as you share in our sufferings, so also you share in our comfort.




B) Wise Words of Explanation

1. That we might be prepared to comfort others.

² Cor 1:8 We do not want you to be uninformed, brothers and sisters, about the troubles we experienced in the province of Asia. We were under great pressure, far beyond our ability to endure, so that we despaired of life itself. ^{9a} Indeed, we felt we had received the sentence of death.




Pro. 3:5 Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight.

prayers. Then many will give thanks on our behalf for the gracious favor granted us in answer to the prayers of many.



III. SUFFERING: HANDLING ITS PERPLEXITIES


- A) Instead of focusing only on yourself now, think of how you can help others later.

C) Rather than getting even which seems to come more naturally, try giving thanks.




In God's divine purpose He has included suffering to make the melody of our song harmonious.
