


Reformers




Philipp Melanchthon

"[He] declared that with tears as abundant as the waters of the river Elbe he could not express his grief over the distractions of Christendom and the "fury of theologians."



Acts 6:1b "among them complained against the Hebraic Jews because their widows were being overlooked in the daily distribution of food."






Acts 10:13b "Arise, Peter, kill and eat!"



apostles and elders about this question.





Acts 15:7b "Brothers, you know that some time ago God made a choice among you that the Gentiles might hear from my lips the message of the gospel and believe.



Acts 15:10 Now then, why do you try to test God by putting on the necks of Gentiles a yoke that neither we nor our ancestors have been able to bear?


Acts 15:11 "No! We believe it is through the grace of our Lord Jesus that we are saved, just as they are."

Acts 15:12 The whole assembly became silent as they listened to Barnabas and Paul telling about the signs and wonders God had done among the


Gentiles through them.




CONCLUSION:
