Waiting reminds us that we are not in charge, and we are not in control.





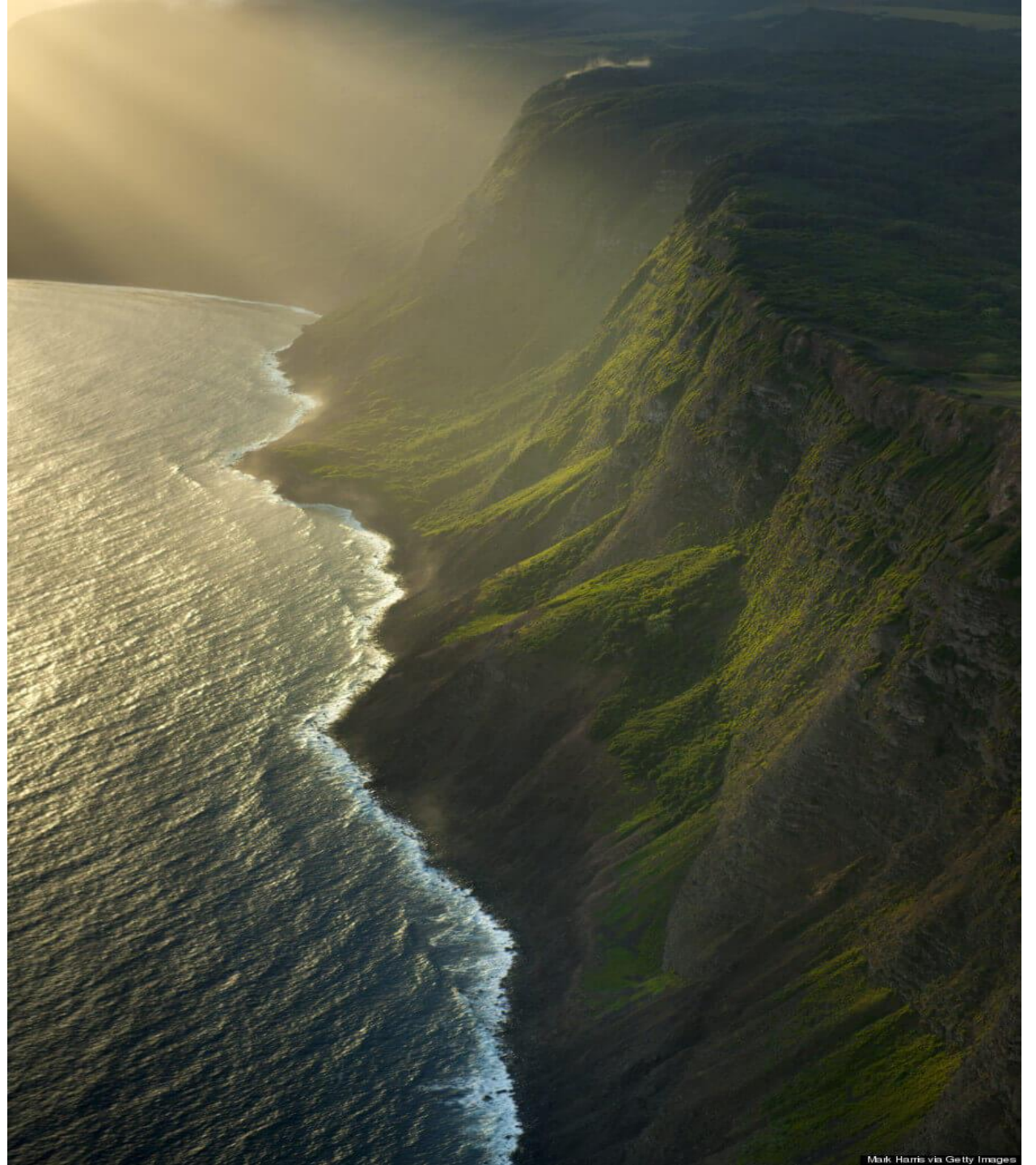
