


Acts 17:4 Some of the Jews were persuaded and joined Paul and Silas, as did a large number of Godfearing Greeks and quite a few prominent women.






Acts 17:6b they dragged Jason and some other believers before the city officials, shouting:
"These men who have caused trouble all over the world have now come here, 7a and Jason has welcomed them into his house.








Acts 17:9 Then they made Jason and the others post bond and let them go. 10 As soon as it was night, the believers sent Paul and Silas away to Berea.






IIII. MINISTRY IN BEREA
